Attainment is **good** overall but especially in writing and maths with the percentage of pupils achieving higher levels the best in 5 years.

This year there has been a focus on reading and phonics which has helped reading back to the levels of previous years after a small dip last year.

Attainment is **good** and is showing an increase from last year for all subject areas (reading, writing and maths), with levels in writing and maths returning to levels in 2007-8.

A whole school focus on reading and phonics means reading and writing %'s at level 3+ have increased significantly, with boys surpassing the girls (this does not follow Hertfordshire and national trends).

In maths boys have done particularly well at level 3. We will be working to narrow the gap between girls and boys achievement at level 3 in 2012 – 13.

There were 10 FSM pupils in Year 2

FSM 10 (18%): FSM attainment is good, in reading, maths and writing.

55(100%)of pupils achieved level 2C+

50%(5) of pupils achieved level 3+ in reading.

10%(1) achieved level 3+ in writing
